2 pm - 4 pm **Saxocalypse Quartet** playing an eclectic mix of music including classical, jazz and Latin arrangements for soprano, alto, tenor and baritone saxophones.

The instrumentalists are all local residents in the Upper Calder Valley, Peadar Long on soprano, Helen Lacey on alto, Richard Prince on tenor and John Trewartha on Baritone.

A film about Sand in Your Eye's sand sculpture called **Loss is Eternal** which was created in 2014. The sculpture depicts the moment when a wife of a soldier opens a letter common during WW1 with the words. **WE REGRET TO INFORM YOU YOUR HUSBAND HAS BEEN KILLED IN ACTION**
