## Sat March 10\* Melvyn Bragg

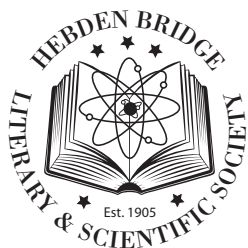
William Tyndale: the greatest Englishman?
